Sunday School Corner

We were blessed last week to learn about two of our lesser-known Orthodox Saints. Yurii Kulyk presented St. Leo of Catania and Ms. Karen shared what she learned of St. Moses the Black of Ethiopia (a.k.a. Moses the Robber).





~St. Leo (703 AD-789 AD) was known for his kindness & charity--especially helping the poor, orphans and widows. After his studies he was ordained a priest and later was consecrated as Bishop of Catania in Sicily. He became widely known speaking out against paganism and heretics. One such heretic was a sorcerer named Heliódoros who denounced and blasphemed God. Heliódoros noisily interrupted a Liturgical service where St. Leo was

serving. He tried using his sorcery--casting spells to confuse and frighten the congregation. St. Leo came out from behind the altar and tied his omophorion around the heretic's neck and led him outside where he challenged him openly who was in the right. St. Leo then commanded a fire be built. Tied to the sorcerer he jumped into the fire. After some time passed St. Leo emerged

unharmed. The flames consumed Heliódoros and he perished. For this miracle and others he performed throughout his life St. Leo became renowned and received many honors by the Emperors of Constantinople. He died peacefully at the age of 86.



~ St. Moses the Black (330 AD - 405 AD) can be viewed as almost the polar opposite of St. Leo. Where St. Leo was a man of peace and charity, St. Moses came from a life of violence. He was a slave of a government official in Egypt, where he was dismissed for theft and suspected murder. He became involved with a vicious gang of robbers who caused terror and mayhem in the communities they roamed in the Nile River valley. Attempting to hide from local authorities after one robbery, he took

shelter with some monks in a desert colony. The dedication of their lives, as well as their peace and contentment, influenced Moses deeply. He gave up his old way of life and became a Christian and joined the monastic community. In time he was ordained a priest. It was not easy as he was tempted at times to go back to his former way of life. He remained strong in his faith and persevered against many trials and tribulations. He was a Christian who lived by the spirit of the law, and not necessarily the letter of the law. This was especially true in his views on judging others and in keeping the Paschal Fast, which was developed at this time.

He and several other monks died violent deaths at the hands of bandits who attacked the monastery. Ordering most of the monks to retreat before the attack it is said he, as a former robber, felt it right that he remain behind, quoting from Matthew 26:52 that "All who take the sword shall perish by the sword".




