time to explain various techniques, encouraging everyone to express themselves while offering personalized tips along the way.


With music playing softly in the background and shared snacks and drinks, it turned into a wonderful afternoon of laughter, art, and new friendships.

fies Christ as being the sole head of the Christian church. The curve of the ceiling represents heaven above. The cupolas can be any color with gold being the most common. It is interesting to note that the number of domes a church has is symbolic. For example, three domes symbolize, the Holy Trinity; five represent Christ and the four evangelists-Matthew, Mark, Luke and John; 13 represents Christ and the 12 apostles (the 12th being Matthias who replaced Judas Iscariot). And what would 33 domes represent? The age of Christ on earth!

Just as brick, mortar and beams physically support the building, the Church structure serves to support our faith and our spiritual history in a very tangible way. The "concrete" lessons are there for all to see!

Teen Group:

We briefly reviewed some major points of Orthodox Church Architecture from our previous week ending with the shape of our church - acknowledging that the ceiling does suggest a "star", as the Intermediate class decided, but the perimeter inside and outside represents a hexagon. Like a circle it is endless and the faithful will be forever united with Christ because the church, like the circle has no beginning and no end. We completed this review with the "Pantocrator or Almighty One" - which is the icon of Christ in the middle of our dome. The answer to what is in Christ's left arm and hand is the Bible: - Old or New Testament? What is his right hand symbolizing?

Next we addressed our forthcoming unit of study - "Beyond the Royal Doors" beginning with the center and the Altar Table, which is slightly elevated from the floor to symbolize the purpose of the altar is to raise us up to heaven. Jesus gathered around a table with His apostles for the Last Supper, so He gathers us around the "Altar Table" to feed us His precious Body and Blood - (Holy Communion) during the worship and prayers of our Liturgy. Next week we will continue with what is at the center of the Altar Table - "The Tabernacle".


